

A new helmet for PTW riders could transform safety for some of the most vulnerable of road users. The Reevu MSX1 helmet features a tiny mirror in the top of the visor, which allows riders to see what is behind them.



The technology has been adapted from a concept for divers to communicate when on submerged deep-sea oil rigs.

When riders wear a Reevu Motorbike helmet, their view of the road ahead is not affected in any way. The view behind, however, is so dramatically transformed that they can see the road behind with their peripheral vision. The company that manufactures the helmet reports that customers have commented that after a short period of time, you are able to maintain awareness of the road ahead and behind without making a conscious effort. This means no shakier steering when looking over your shoulder and no loss of vision of the road ahead when you are looking behind you.
